
Demonstrative Adjectives

A demonstrative adjective is a type of determiner that distinguishes one noun from others





"This": *near* the speaker, singular



Ex) **These** buildings

"These": near the speaker, plural



Ex) **That** island



Ex) **Those** islands

"That": far from the speaker, singular

"Those": far from the speaker, plural
