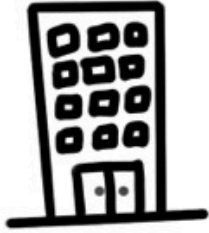


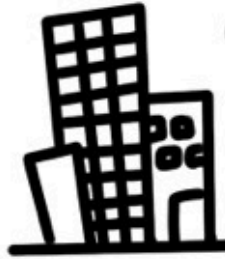
Demonstrative Adjectives

A demonstrative adjective is a type of determiner that distinguishes one noun from others



Ex) **This** building

"This": *near* the speaker, singular



Ex) **These** buildings

"These": *near* the speaker, plural



Ex) **That** island

"That": *far* from the speaker, singular



Ex) **Those** islands

"Those": *far* from the speaker, plural

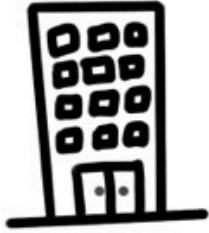

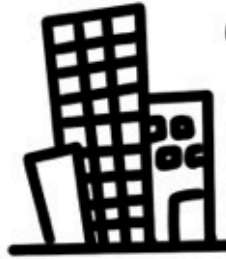
