

# Comparative Adverbs

Comparative adverbs compare how, when, where, or to what extent **TWO** actions are performed. They show that one action happens “more” or “less” than the other.

For short adverbs, add an “**~er**”. For longer adverbs, add “**more/less**”.

**Directions:** Use the given word as a comparative adverb in a sentence. Do not change the given word into a different word. The first one is done for you.

- 1.[Aggressive]: The female soccer players played **more aggressively** than the male soccer players.

*Answers may vary.*

- 2.[Predictable]:

use “more/less” predictably

- 3.[Convincing]:

use “more/less” convincingly

- 4.[Precise]:

use “more/less” precisely

- 5.[Cautious]:

use “more/less” cautiously

- 6.[Respectful]:

use “more/less” respectfully
