Singular Noun

Usually, you can add "s" to the singular noun to make it plural. Based on the spelling of the singular noun, the rules may change.

change y to ~ies

ends in s, ss, sh, ch, x, z	add ~es
ends in f or fe	replace with ~ves
ends in a consonant + o	add ~es
