Correlative conjunctions are **pairs** of words or phrases that link parts of a sentence.

He neither attended the meeting nor submitted the report.

2. You can choose to stay home. You can choose to go to the theme park.

You can choose either to stay home or to go to the theme park.

3. She is talented. She is hardworking.

She is not only talented, but also hardworking.

4. Manny would prefer to travel by train. Manny would not travel by car.

Manny would prefer to travel by train rather than travel by car.

5. It rains tomorrow. The picnic will be canceled.

If it rains tomorrow, then the picnic will be cancelled.
