

# Possessive Nouns

Possessive nouns show ownership or a close relationship. They're typically formed by adding an apostrophe + "s" to the end of the noun.

	Apostrophe rules	Example
Singular nouns	add 's	Angie's snacks
Names ending in "s"	add 's or only '	Thomas's snacks Thomas' snacks
plural nouns	add '	friends' snacks
plural nouns not ending in "s"	add 's	people's snacks
