

Perfect Verb Tense

Perfect tense shows an action completed before a given point in time. They are formed by using “has/have/had” before the past participle of the main verb.

Verb tense	Rules	Examples
Past perfect tense	add “ had ”+ past participle of verb	They had walked
Present perfect tense	add “ has/have ” + past participle of verb	They have walked She has walked
Future perfect tense	add “ will have ” + past participle of verb	They will have walked She will have walked
