# Prepositional phrase

A prepositional phrase begins with a preposition and ends with a noun, pronoun, or a noun phrase (object of the preposition). The prepositional phrase can act as an adjectival phrase or an adverbial phrase.

**Directions: Add a prepositional phrase in the blank space to include more details to the sentence. Do not repeat the same prepositional phrase more than once.**

**HINT:** Prepositional phrases may start with:

*about, above, across, after, against, before, behind, beneath, beyond, by, during, except, for, from, in, into, of, on, outside, over, past, since, through, under, until, with, without,*
